Waiting for Court Date

From the time you are arrested or charged and appear in court, it will typically take **10 DAYS** for Mr. Work to receive the police report and any offers from the District Attorney. Please be patient during this window in time. It is best to have constructive conversations which require Mr. Work to have *all* evidence before providing any legal advice or evaluation of your case.

Before Court

Mr. Work arrives to all court hearing **ONE HOUR** early to ensure you will have the opportunity to speak with him in detail about the case and any issues or concerns.

Plea Offers and Police Reports

Once the District Attorney makes a formal plea offer or resolution, Mr. Work will deliver that offer and/or report to you **immediately**.

Preparing for Court

Males please **WEAR A TIE** a Judge will take you as serious as you take yourself. Females, please wear **business professional clothing**.

Take a deep breathe, you're in good hands.

Proactive Steps to Take BEFORE Court

Regardless of guilt or innocence, there are steps you can take *immediately* to greatly increase your chances of obtaining a favorable result in your case.

If ALCOHOL was involved in your case

Ex: DUI, Domestic Battery, Simple Battery, Obstructing and Resisting, Trespassing etc.
